Ordinance No. 2020-4

AN ORDINANCE

AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS AND ENTER INTO ONE OR MORE CONTRACTS FOR THE PRIVATE CURBSIDE COLLECTION OF SOLID WASTE AND RECYCLABLE WASTE PRODUCTS, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City's current contract with Browning-Ferris Industries of Ohio to provide curbside collection of solid waste and recyclable waste products will expire on August 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to continue to provide qualified Berea residents with solid waste and recycling pick-up services; and

WHEREAS, the Administration wishes to advertise for bids and to enter into one or more contracts with a vendor to provide these necessary City services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Berea, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That the Director of Public Service be, and hereby is authorized to advertise for bids and, after approval of the Board of Control, to enter into one or more contracts with the lowest, most responsive and responsible bidder(s) for the curbside collection of solid waste and recyclables, all in accordance with specifications on file in the office of the Director of Public Service.

SECTION 2. That the Director of Finance be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to pay out such contract sum(s), after approval by the Board of Control, and that the funds therefor are hereby appropriated from the General Fund, designated for accounting purposes as Fund No. 100.

SECTION 3. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.


SECTION 4. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety and welfare, or providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department, and for the further reason that an early effective date is necessary to allow the successful bidder to engage in preparations to provide the contracted services. Therefore, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law.


