AN ORDINANCE

**AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE TO DONATE
A 2004 FORD E-350, NO LONGER NEEDED FOR MUNICIPAL PURPOSES, TO THE
NORTH END FOUNDATION OF BEREA, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

WHEREAS, the City owns a 2004 Ford E-350, VIN 1FTSS34L94HB15213, with 132,179 miles, that is no longer needed for municipal purposes; and

WHEREAS, the North End Foundation of Berea manages the Berea Youth Works Program, which provides summer jobs for Berea youth, ages 16 – 18; and

WHEREAS, in addition to other services provided to the public, Berea Youth Works provides lawn cutting services to needy Berea residents whom may not otherwise qualify for the City's senior lawn cutting program; and

WHEREAS, in order to provide these services to Berea residents, the North End Foundation is in need of a vehicle to transport Berea youth and equipment to and from work locations; and

WHEREAS, the Administration and Council of the City of Berea wish to support the North End Foundation of Berea in its mission to provide summer employment opportunities for Berea youth and to provide vital services, including lawn cutting services, to Berea residents in need.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Berea, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That the Director of Public Service is hereby authorized to transfer and donate, on behalf of the City, a 2004 Ford E-350, VIN 1FTSS34L94HB15213, to the North End Foundation of Berea, an Ohio not-for-profit corporation, and that the public auction or bidding for the sale of the same is not necessary as this Council finds that the donation of the vehicle is in the best interests of the City of Berea and its residents.

SECTION 2. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety and welfare, or providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department, and for the further reason that it is vital to allow lawn cutting services to be made available immediately to Berea residents. Therefore, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
